

Project to Strengthen Emergency Medical Care Capacity Using POCUS in Rural Areas of Mongolia

- Cardiovascular disease and trauma have become major causes of death in Mongolia, and the quality of emergency medical care can be improved by enhancing the use of Point-of-Care Ultrasound (POCUS).
- The training program developed in Japan by the POCUS Study Group was offered to doctors in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia in 2021.
- In cooperation with members of the Mongolian Society of Emergency Medicine, the online version of the POCUS training package and guidelines will be developed and provided to doctors in rural areas. By the end of the fiscal year, we will consider continuing POCUS training in Mongolia and support the development of the guidelines.
- Through this project, it is expected that the capacity of doctors engaged in emergency care in Mongolia will be improved. It is expected that the level of emergency medical care in Mongolia as a whole will be improved if it is possible to hold trainings for rural areas. (In view of the situation of the COVID-19 pandemics, the experts plan to conduct remote training online from Japan, and the plan assumes that on-site training will be available at the end of the fiscal year.)
