

Project for Participatory Human Resource Development and Education/Training System Enhancement for Emergency Medical Care in Cambodia.

In Cambodia, the demand for emergency transportation is increasing, but the emergency medical system and standardized educational system are not yet in place. In Japan, standardized education has become widespread, and by referencing JPTEC™ and JATEC™, the aim is to build an education system tailored to the local context and to promote standardized education. This will help improve the development of human resources in emergency medical care and raise the level of emergency medical services provided.

The NCGM Hospital Emergency and Critical Care Center, in cooperation with Kokushikan University and the Japan Emergency Medical Technicians Association(JELSTA), will dispatch personnel well-versed in pre-hospital emergency medical care to Cambodia. They will collaborate with the Cambodian Ministry of Health and national hospitals to train and develop leaders and provide training related to pre-hospital emergency medical care. Working together with local authorities and leaders, they will establish a standardized education system, aiming to operate self-sustaining educational courses and promote standardized education throughout Cambodia.
