

## Project to strengthen clinical skills and develop qualified personnel for Cybernics treatment for the labor security organizations of Southeast Asian countries, with Malaysia as the master trainer country

- ① In Southeast Asian countries, there is a high need for rehabilitation for the working generation due to lifestyle habits and traffic accidents. However, in countries such as Indonesia, rehabilitation is carried out by a small number of physical therapists, and the introduction of efficient rehabilitation is expected. The Indonesian Ministry of Health and the Employee Social Security Agency are very concerned about this issue. The same is true in the Philippines and Thailand.
- ② With the aim of popularizing Cybernics (HAL), we will provide training to medical professionals mainly in Indonesia, the Philippines, Thailand, and Vietnam.
- ③ The University of Tsukuba, Keio University, and Hiroshima University, which have ample experience in treating patients with HAL, will work with the Indonesian Physical Therapist Association to provide training to hospitals affiliated with the Indonesian Social Security Agency and public government hospitals. Similar programs will also be rolled out in the Philippines, Thailand, and Vietnam.
- ④ Through this training, we aim to develop master trainers with a full understanding of HAL within Indonesia's public hospitals by 2025. Through these master trainers, we will promote the use of HAL in hospitals in the Jakarta area of Indonesia and establish effective treatment suited to the current situation in the country. We will also simultaneously expand to the Philippines and Thailand.
