

Development of clinical management and infection prevention and control (IPC) of Emerging Infectious Disease and Antimicrobial resistance among World Health Organization Western Pacific Regional Office (WPRO)

March 4, 2021

- Many countries in the WHO Western Pacific Regional Office (WPRO) region lack capacity for clinical management and infection prevention and control (IPC) of emerging infectious diseases (EIDs) and antimicrobial resistance (AMR), and there is a need to improve capacity and respond to outbreaks.
- The National Center for Global Health and Medicine (NCGM) is a national center that specializes in infectious diseases and has accumulated medical skills in clinical management and IPC. It will collaborate with WPRO to provide training and outbreak response in areas of the region that lack capacity in clinical management and IPC.
- NCGM will collaborate with WPRO to improve clinical management and IPC capacity for EIDs and AMR, human resource development, and early outbreak resolution in the WPRO region through training and outbreak response by the end of February 2022.
