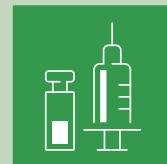
Public health emergency preparedness and response

Our Aim

To prepare for and respond to health emergencies, including infectious disease outbreaks in Japan and overseas

Our Actions

Upon the request of the government, dispatching medical experts around the world in response to natural disasters, conflicts, and outbreaks of infectious diseases



Disease control

Our Aim

To promote effective disease prevention and control of communicable diseases and noncommunicable diseases, considering the diversity of target populations and local settings for each disease

Our Actions

1. Providing technical assistance through field projects
2. Generating evidence through research projects
3. Disseminating our findings to global networks such as the World Health Organization (WHO) and Global Fund

In collaboration with the Japanese government and WHO Global Outbreak Alert Response Network (GOARN), staff members are dispatched to the field to address public health concerns in pandemic prevention, preparedness, and response.



Access & Delivery

Our Aim

To deliver high-quality health technologies and products to low- and middle-income countries in the appropriate form to improve people's health in the country.

We comprehensively cover the following seven steps: Situation Analysis, Research/Development, Regulatory Authorization, Selection/Prioritization, Public Procurement, Distribution/Storage, and Health Service Delivery.

Our Actions

1. Conducting studies to share our experience and findings with partners in domestic and global societies
2. Organizing seminars/lectures as opportunities for our partners in the public and private sectors, particularly for Japanese manufacturers, to obtain up-to-date information and knowledge related to access and delivery
3. Providing information in a way that enhances people's understanding of domestic/global trends.



Health for vulnerable populations (VPs)

Our Aim

To integrate VPs into national and sub-national plans and the implementation of PPRR* for health security and public health emergencies, in order to "Build Forward Better" after the COVID-19 pandemic, from the following five viewpoints: Understanding VP communities/Disseminating information/Promoting Community Engagement/ Ensuring access to health & social protection services/Creating a supportive environment.

* Prevention, Preparedness, Response, and Recovery

Our Actions

Since 2020, activities include developing models for

1. disseminating health information,
2. creation of pathways for access to health services,
3. addressing social, economic, and cultural issues, and
4. creation of synergies between initiatives for non-Japanese persons and their corresponding countries.



Quality health service delivery and human resources

Our Aim

To address emerging health challenges early and contribute to the establishment of health service delivery systems that "leave no one behind"

Our Actions

1. Providing technical inputs to international organizations such as WHO, the Global Fund, JICA, L'amicale de la Santé en Afrique Francophone (LAF), and Health System Global
2. Providing direct technical inputs to low- and middle-income

countries to develop, dispatch and retain competent health workforces and to deliver better health services at health facilities

3. Conducting health policy research and implementation research on quality health service delivery and health workforces in Asia and Africa
4. Organizing training courses in Japan and abroad to achieve universal health coverage through quality health service delivery and health workforces

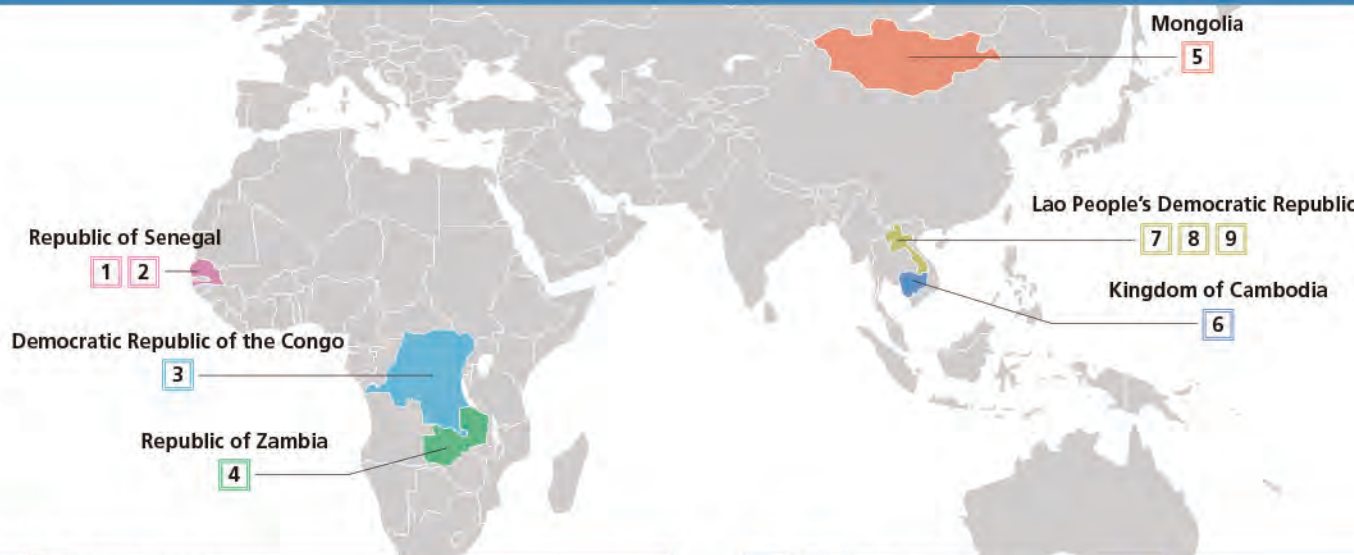
